Joe Honda who was fatally injured in Mine #3 on the 8th day of March was my partner, we were at work in No 22 Entry 43 Room mine #3. We needed some track laid but one of the rails being bent, we put the rail between two props, but one of the props not being properly set was pushed out by us pulling on the rail to straighten it. We got the rail straighten and laid down when Honda said he would set the props that we had pushed out while straightening the rail and was in the act of lifting the prop when the rock fell on him causing his injuries

Morgan Griffiths being duly sworn deposes and says that I was coming out of #8 Entry about 10 o'clock a.m. when I got to the scope being the rope runner, I said there was an empty trip coming ^{up and} I thought that some man was hurt. I stopped the trip when he got to #8 and found Honda and Maki in the car also T. Davis. I rang the trip up and went out side with them. Mr. Sweeney was out side when we got there and he went over to the stable to order the ambulance. We packed Honda into my office where it was warm until the ambulance came, when he was in the office he asked for something to drink. I gave him some tea that I had in my basket. I inquired of him where he felt hurt he said on his right hip. The ambulance came and took him home. I am Mine Foreman for the Union Pac Coal Co at No 3 Mine River Spgs S.W. Mo. After dinner I went down to 43 Room Entry 22 and examined the place and found a care of Rock and a prop discharger

Morgan Griffiths

W. P. Maki being duly sworn by Cornor Skedd deposes and says that I am a coal digger I work in #3 Mine River Spgs S.W. Mo. We were going to lay track Honda and I and one of the rails we were going to lay was crooked and we were going to straighten that crooked rail between the props and one of the props fell down. We got the rail straightened and spiked in its place. Then Joe Honda told me he was going to put the prop up again and when he put the prop up. The rock fell on him as soon as he took hold of the prop and when the rock fell on his back he called on me to come and help him and I went down to help him but he had got loose before I got to him. Honda told me that he was hurt but thought it would be all right pretty soon but after a little while he complained of bad pain in his side then he told me to get some one who could talk Finn and English so as he could tell the driver to take him up, then the drivers took him out side. Been working two months. Did not get prop up before the rock fell. The rock would not have fallen if prop had not been knocked out. The room was 43 Entry #22 Mine 3. The accident happened on the 8th day of March 1893

I am a coal miner. I work in #4 Mine. Ah Kay was a coal miner. He was working in #7 Entry. I was in the entry when the rock fell upon Ah Kay. Ah Kay was told by the other Chinaman that the rock was loose but he assured "no" that it was alright. Immediately afterwards the rock fell and hit him on the side and on the legs. The rock fell about 2 o'clock in the afternoon of the 23rd of March 1893. He was taken home and died the same evening between ten and twelve o'clock. Ah Kay was 51 years of age.

Jos Soulsby testifies

I am foreman of #4 Mine. Word came out that a Chinaman was hurt in #7 entry. I went down right away and met the trip coming up with the Chinaman. I returned to the mouth of the pit with him and helped to take him out of the car. We then put him on a stretcher and placed same on wagon and sent him home. David Jones and I went down the mine to the place where the rock had fallen. I saw there was a slip right across the rock from which the rock had fallen. It was about eight inches thick and might have weighed 200 to 300 pounds.

Joseph Soulsby

We the undersigned jurors empannelled as a jury by Jos Skeed County Coroner, to enquire into the cause of the death of the Chinaman, whose dead body now lies before us, do find that his name is Ah Kay. That he was 51 years of age and that he came to his death by a rock falling from the roof upon him in #7 entry in #4 Mine in town of Rock Springs County of Sweetwater State of Wyoming on Thursday March 23rd 1893 at about 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

We further find that he came to his death through his own carelessness and no blame can be attached to the W.P. Coal Co nor any of their employees.

First Witness. Thos Gray was duly sworn and testifies as follows.

My occupation is a miner, working in No 3 Mine. The deceased daughter came to Mrs Flockhart last night about eight o'clock PM and said she was uneasy about her father as he had not got home from work. Mrs Flockhart came to me, Thos Gray, and asked if I would go to No 7 mine see where her father was and what kept him so long. Myself and five other went to No 7 mine and we saw the watchman and asked him if he saw any person coming out of the mine. He said no and we went in and met two drivers and we asked them if they saw any person going out and they told us no. So we went on to No 62 Room and went up to the face of said room and the first thing we saw was a coal car off the track, then we went up to where some rock had fallen. I look around and found the deceased under some rock and I called to some of the men and told them to bring a hammer so as to break the rock. It took six of us to lift the rock from the deceased and found him dead. We took him out and laid him on the side until we made a stretcher and took him outside and took him home. When the deceased was found he was in a sitting position with his head forced to the bottom rock.

The testimony of Jas Trigg, Wm Coulson Wm Green Fred Russell Fred Neil the same as Thos Gray.

Edward L Erans was duly sworn and testifies as follows: He was asked by Mine Inspector Thomas if he saw the condition of the room that J M Churchie was killed in. Yes. Did you notice if the work done by deceased was done with care or not? It was not. Mr Erans said the deceased drilled his holes into the roof and never took down the loose rock, which he should have done. All the jury how many holes you saw drilled into the roof within a radius of ten or twelve feet. Four or five. Did you notice if the loose or fallen rock was caused by those holes I did. If the deceased was inclined to touch this room were there props in his room at the time to timber with? There was. Did you ever mention to deceased about danger to him by drilling into the roof? I did. What would be the size of rock in your estimation 8 ft x 10 and 8 inches thick.

STATEMENTS OF WITNESSES.

Rock Springs July 25 1893

On the morning of the 25th July 1893 I went to my work in No 1 mine 3d entry room 21. At the time of accident to my partner C. Bothine we was going to tamp a hole for a blast. I was standing about 6 feet from my partner C. Bothine. He had just put the powder into the hole when a piece of slate fell from the roof 6 inches thick and 18 to 20 feet long fell on him causing his death a short time afterwards. I am sure no one to blame.

The testimony of Jas Parks
I went into the place some time afterwards and examined the place. I found the rock that killed the man and saw it. I would judge that the rock that fell would be about 18 feet long, but not in one piece, it was about 5 feet broad and 6 feet thick. I found it was propped in good condition just as good as general run of rooms. On top side of place was shot fired nearly touching the roof but not touching right above the other shot previous to one they had fired caused a blow shot. As far as I can judge these shots had tendency to loosen the roof.

The rock that fell on him was 18 feet long 5 feet broad and 6 inches thick. It fell between the props and the face of room.
