
Dear Sirs:-

Dear Sir:--

In consideration of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) per body you agree to prepare for interment each body at the most convenient place to be determined upon at the time, whether at the mouth of the mine or at some other point within the Town of Hanna. We to furnish the caskets. This to include proper disrobing, examination of clothes, proper cleansing of the bodies where possible, and the embalming of such bodies as may be found possible that are expected to be shipped away from Hanna. This refers to the fifty-three (53) bodies, more or less, now in Number One Mine at Hanna, which the Company hopes to recover.

The recovery and delivery of these bodies to you may be, and probably will be, intermittent and your prompt services shall be required under the circumstances, whether it be one body or more.

In addition thereto we shall pay you for the necessary travelling expenses between Rawlins and Hanna; and for time one day each way as we call upon you for your services, at the rate of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per day. We shall also reimburse you any monies advanced by you for any legal expenses brought against your profession on account of laws. We shall also pay you the cost of such material you shall find necessary for use in the embalming of

bodies and for such material found to be necessary in disinfection. The vouchers for such material shall correspond with prices of material furnished as are sold at other houses who deal in articles of that class.

We have your letter of April 6th, received to-day, relative to Aaron Madden, killed in the recent explosion here. Your telegram was not received here.

We have not telegraphed you for the reason that the County officials have charge of your father's property and will hold the same until your two sisters and yourself are here and final settlement is made so that the estate can be properly divided. Mrs. Laura Whitney has been here but returned to Colorado Springs yesterday morning.

The mine is sealed at present and will not be opened for a week or ten days. It is very doubtful whether or not the bodies will be in condition to make positive identifications in all cases but should we be able to find the body of Aaron Madden we will notify you at once.

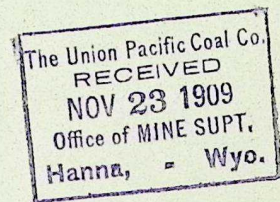


Dear Sir:-
