
Helping Homeschoolers in the Public Library



What is Homeschooling?

Homeschooling is:

- a nonpublic home-based educational program
- provided by the child's parent or an adult relative designated by the parent
- not under the supervision and control of a school district
- not considered a private or nonprofit school

(Colorado Department of Education)

Colorado Homeschool Law



Families must file a notice of intent to homeschool from ages 7 to 16.

Children will be tested or evaluated in 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 11th grades.

Who Homeschools?

- Families who teach their children full-time
- Families whose children attend some classes at a public, charter or private school
- Families who choose online education
