Researching Federal Statutes

- Enacted by Congress
- > With approval of the President
- Issued in a three part model for publication
 - > Slip laws
 - > Session laws
 - > Codified

Slip Laws

- > First published in individual pamphlets
- Citation for a slip law includes the public law number
- Covers both private and public laws
- > Free access to slip laws
 - > Federal Depository Library
 - ➤ Govinfo Public Laws
 - ➤ Govinfo Private Laws
 - ➤ Congress.gov

Session Laws

- Published in the United States Statutes at Large
- Official compilation of the laws of each session of Congress
- Includes both public and private laws
- > Subject index a at the end of each volume.
- Free access to the Statutes at Large
 - United States Statutes at Large (Law Library of Congress)
 - United States Statutes at Large (Govinfo)

Codified Law

- Laws passed by Congress that are of a "general and permanent" nature
- Published in the United States Code (USC) and includes
 - Statutes at Large
 - General Index
 - Popular names table
 - Classification tables
 - Executive orders & Proclamations
- Free access to the U.S. Code
 - Office of Law Revision Counsel
 - Govinfo.gov
 - Law Library of Congress
 - Cornell Legal Information Institute
 - Justia

 - > PRINT
 - >Statutes at Large
 - > ONLINE
 - United States Statutes at Large (Govinfo.gov)
 - >Statutes at Large (Congress.gov)

 - > PRINT
 - > Statutes at Large
 - > ONLINE
 - Legislation Popular Titles and Short Titles (Congress.gov)
 - ➤ Popular Name Tool (OLRC)
 - Statute Compilations (Office of the Legislative Counsel)

- ➤ If you want to locate the law as codified in the United States Code and you know the public or private law number
 - > Print
 - Statutes at Large tables in the United States Code.
 - > Online
 - Statutes at Large table to the United States
 Code (OLRC)

- When you want to locate the law as codified in the United States Code and you know the name of the law
 - > Print
 - > Popular name tables in the United States Code
 - > Online
 - ► Popular Name Tool (OLRC)
 - ➤ United States Code Annotated (Westlaw)
 - ➤ United States Code Service (Lexis)

When you want to locate the law as codified in the United States Code and you know the subject of the law

PRINT

► Use the index to the United States Code.

ONLINE

Search the <u>United States Code</u> on the OLRC website




